Rebuild Alabama Transportation Plan

WHEREAS, During the 2019 Special Session, in an effort to address infrastructure funding, the Legislature passed House Bill 2 which increased the motor fuel tax by 6 cents in 2019, 2 additional cents in 2020, and 2 additional cents in 2021, which designates for the 10 cent Gasoline Tax. HB2 also included the ATRIP-II program setting aside a state match program for local projects of public use; and


WHEREAS for 2019, \$30 million will be available for local governments to apply for. Expected funds and the accountability requirements imposed by the Act enforces requirements on the County and Municipalities as it relates to the expenditure of the funds created.

THEREFORE, RESOLVED that the Town of Douglas, Alabama hereby adopt an annual Rebuild Alabama Transportation Plan in acceptance of ATRIP-II Rebuild Alabama Infrastructure Program.

Transportation Plan

Pursuant to Resolution No. 8-15-22, of the Town of Douglas, Alabama, the following strategic plan for expenditure of funds received from the Rebuild Alabama Act (ACT #2019-2) the funds received will be allocated as follows for fiscal year 2021-22.

The **estimated** revenue to be received by the Town of Douglas is \$19,050.00 which will help fund the following:

1. Accumulating money for a future project.

Streets will be completed as funding allows, and any excess funding will be allocated to the next years budgeted project.

All funds spent on the above referred to project will be kept in a separate file, and subject to audit at the end of the budget year.

All project bids will be done in accordance with Section 39-2-6 Code of Alabama 1975.

A written report shall be presented to the Mayor and Council at the first meeting in January of each year detailing the expenditures made from the fund during the previous fiscal year, and include the status of all projects listed in the transportation plan. The report shall be entered into the minutes of the council meeting, and made available for public inspection.
